Swale wide there has been a sharp increase in fraud incidents. Swale residents have been reporting that they have received phone calls from someone claiming to be a police officer. They give a fake police officer name and force number and state they are part of the Economical Crime Team at Sittingbourne Police Station (There isn't such a department in Sittingbourne). They claim there have been some irregularities spotted within the bank account of the person they are calling before requesting the person hangs up and calls the police. The criminal pretending to be a police officer will keep the line open their end and when the poor victim calls 999, they will pretend to be a police call taker where they then ask for the victim's bank details. Thankfully those that have reported these incidents to the police have not given out their bank details and become a victim of this crime. However, historically this type of crime is under reported through embarrassment and shame. There is nothing to be embarrassed or ashamed of; these criminals are highly sophisticated and unfortunately very good at what they do. If you or someone you know has been a victim of this type of crime, please advise they call their bank first and then call the police on 101and report it. The sooner it is reported, the more likely it is we can prevent the loss of your money.

I requested Speedwatch Kent carry out some speed checks in callaway's Lane, Newington following an issue regarding speeding being raised by a local resident. Speedwatch conducted a speed check on Thursday 8th May 2025 between 1600 hours and 1700 hours. The results are as follows:

- TotalNumber of Cars 56
- Number speeding 6
- Speeds recorded ranged from 25 to 28 mph



Spring wildflowers for the Community Woodland

Over the past 4 years we have been thinning the woodland each year to allow light in (under licence from the Forestry Commission). The time is now right to start encouraging wildflowers, starting with Bluebells (Hyacinthoides non-scripta – UK native wildflowers). Approved by Swale Borough Council Planning Committee on 22 May.

Application: 25/501640/REM Land At Pond Farm, London Road, Newington Proposal: Approval of reserved matters (appearance, landscaping, layout and scale sought) for erection of 135 residential dwellings, including retention of existing farm buildings, public open space, landscaping, sustainable drainage system (SuDS) and vehicular access pursuant to 22/500275/OUT.
