NEWINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 25 September 2019 in the Newington Room, Newington Village Hall.

Present: Cllr Tony Mould (Vice Chairman), Cllr Dean Coles, Cllr Ryan Condron, Cllr Richard Geldard, Cllr Steve Godmon, Cllr Stephen Harvey, Cllr Elaine Jackson Cllr Eric Layer, Cllr James Morgan and Cllr Richard Palmer; and Mrs Wendy Licence (Clerk).

Also present were County Councillor Mike Whiting and one member of the public.

1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

In the absence of the Chairman, Cllr Mould took the Chair and welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Apologies had been received from Cllr Debbie Haigh (unwell); apologies accepted.

Apologies had also been received from Ward Member Alan Horton (at another meeting); apology noted.

2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

None were declared.

3. VISITORS

ii. County Councillor

It was agreed to bring this item forward to allow KCCIIr Whiting to leave early to attend a meeting with the Kent Police and Crime Commissioner.

KCCIIr Whiting said the Gladmans' verdict was an important result for the village and a good outcome. Kent County Council has limited powers concerning air quality management which falls to Swale Borough Council. However, Kent County Council is responsible for Public health issues and officers have been requested to look into air quality which affects so many people. KCCIIr Whiting reported that it is hoped the road closures in Newington will be managed during the gas main replacement which starts on 30 September. The Clerk is Southern Gas Networks' point of contact for news and KCCIIr Whiting said he will post on his Facebook page. The works had been delayed until next year but has been accelerated to avert supply issues through the winter. SGN has been asked to put an HGV ban during the works and KCC Highways is in discussion with the company, HGVs will not be able to pass through the High Street but will have access from either end on the A2 for essential journeys.

Cllr Harvey said he has requested an emergency contact number from SGN. There is a footpath closure through Paradise farm which suggests the brickearth extraction is imminent, can this be postponed? Can the hedges in the back lanes be cut back to allow easier passing for vehicles?

KCCIIr Whiting said the hedge cutting is on KCC Highways list of things to do and there is a meeting on Friday to discuss the gas works. Only Kent Police can enforce a ban and KCC is seeking to have powers to enforce regulations on their roads with Highway Stewards and PCSOs. KCC Highways has learnt from the previous emergency closure and the issues raised will be dealt with automatically.

Cllr Coles said there continues to be an issue with HGVs coming off Danaway and Bull Lane, the Golf Club has had its property damaged.

KCCIIr Whiting reported that he has spoken to the Golf Club and extra signage has been installed. The issue is how much information is on the drivers' SatNavs and KCC Highways works with providers to ensure they receive updates. It is illegal for HGVs to use any roads south of the A2 but it still needs to be enforced.

Cllr Harvey said he was concerned that SGN may use the cheapest contractors.

KCCIIr Whiting said the contract is with SGN and that they need to police the contract, this will be raised at Friday's meeting.

Cllr Coles said if there are signs on junction 5 of the M2 that there is no access to the A249 and lorries should use junction 4, foreign lorry drivers will understand.

KCCllr Whiting said Highways England has agreed that if there is an issue on the M2 the M20 will be used and signage will be from Dartford. Operation Brock is being reinstated.

Cllr Mould thanked KCCllr Whiting for attending and for his report.

KCCllr Whiting left the meeting.

Cllr Harvey **PROPOSED** to accept the minutes as a true record of the meeting; **SECONDED** by Cllr Coles: **AGREED UNANIMOUSLY**. Cllr Mould duly signed the minutes as a true record of the meeting.

6. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

<u>Planning Permission for Fence at ball court</u> – Cllr Mould said an Ordnance Survey map is needed.

Cllr Harvey said he will liaise with the Clerk.

<u>Roman Temple</u> Cllr Coles said the Newington History Group is no longer involved in the project which is being dealt with by the archaeologists, Persimmon and Kent County Council.

7. PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

No matters were raised.

8. VISITORS

i. Borough Councillors

SBCIIr Palmer reported that there has been a big issue with bins not being collected in the village affecting about 20% of the parish. SBCIIr Palmer said he had written to Biffa who arranged for the bins to be collected but then others were not emptied. The contractor has employed more people and have extra vehicles to address the problem.

Cllr Harvey thanked SBCllr Palmer for his help with the issue and for responding every time when contacted.

SBCIIr Palmer reported the dropped kerb in The Willows is being investigated by KCC Highways to ensure it is legal.

Cllr Morgan asked if there is a plan to adjust the bin collections during the road work on the A2 and how will residents be informed of any changes.

SBCIIr Palmer said if the bins are not collected on the scheduled day they will be collected the following day and that he is concerned for residents who pay to have their bins cleaned following collection. This matter will be raised again.

Cllr Mould thanked SBCllr Palmer for his report.

Cllr Harvey informed Members that a decision is yet to be made.

<u>Ref: 19/502206/FULL 61 Playstool Road, Newington ME9 7NL</u> <u>Proposal: Retrospective application for the erection of a first floor rear extension, loft</u> <u>extension and lean to roof at front and side of dwelling (resubmission of 18/502531/FULL).</u> Cllr Harvey informed Members that following the refusal of the application an appeal could be lodged which would stop the clock for enforcement action.

Ref 19/503203/FULL Land At 6 Ellens Place, Boyces Hill, Newington ME9 7JG Proposal: Erection of a chalet bungalow with detached garage. Creation of new vehicular access and erection of a detached garage to serve no. 6. Cllr Harvey informed Members that a decision is yet to be made.

<u>Ref: 19/502808/FULL 2 Wormdale Farm Cottages, Wormdale Hill, Newington ME9 7PX</u> <u>Proposal: Partial demolition and reconstruction of subsided East side section together with</u> <u>the removal and reinstatement of rear porch.</u>

Cllr Harvey informed Members that the application has been permitted.

Ref: 19/503512/PNQCLA Lion Farm. Rear of 148 High Street, Newington ME9 7JH

Proposal: Prior Notification for change of use of agricultural building to 1no. dwellinghouse and for associated operational development. For its prior approval to: - Transport and Highways impacts of the development - Contamination risks on the site - Noise impacts of the development - Whether the location or siting of the building makes it otherwise impractical or undesirable for the use of the building to change as proposed -Design and external appearance impacts on the building.

Cllr Harvey reported the application has been withdrawn

Ref: 19/503477/FULL Land At Callaways Lane, Newington ME9 7LU

Proposal: Minor Material Amendment to application 19/500844/FULL in order to provide rooflights to the garage along with a staircase.

Cllr Harvey informed Members the application has been permitted and that he and the Clerk had met with the owner prior to the meeting. There is no evidence of wayleave and photographs clearly show the telegraph pole is outside the fence. The planning statement states *"The site boundary is defined by a mix of post and rail fencing, with trees and hedges facing a well defined boundary with the rural access way".* The owner is obtaining advice from KCC Highways and the Parish Council will also check. The owner also claimed the neighbours are complaining about the bins and this is something the Parish Council is not aware of. The Clerk will check with Swale Borough Council to see if the bin can be exchanged for a better type and if it moved to an appropriate location which will then be emptied.

<u>Ref: 19/503564/FULL Wormdale Farm, Wormdale Hill, Newington ME9 7PX</u> <u>Proposal: Erection of steel frame portal building infill between two existing buildings.</u> Cllr Harvey reported to Councillors that a decision is yet to be made.

Ref: 19/503244/FULL 1 Milton Cottages, Keycol Hill, Bobbing ME9 8NE Proposal: Proposed single storey side/rear extension with changes to fenestration. Cllr Harvey informed Councillors that the application has been permitted. Eden Meadow Cllr Harvey said there was no update on this matter.

<u>Ref: 19/500029/FULL Land Rear Of 132 High Street, Newington ME9 7JH</u> <u>Proposal: Erection of a 4 bedroom detached dwelling and associated carport/garage.</u> Cllr Harvey informed Councillors that a decision is yet to be made.

Application Number SW/16/507594/RVAR (KCC/SW/0526/2018) Paradise Farm, Lower Hartlip Road, Hartlip, Sittingbourne ME9 7SR Cllr Harvey said the extraction of the brickearth is about to start and it will not be helpful to have the lorries going through the village during the gas main replacement on the A2.

Medway Planning Policy update

Cllr Harvey said there will be no response from the Parish Council.

Ref: 17/505711/HYBRID Land At Wises Lane, Borden ME10 1GD

Proposal: Hybrid planning application with outline planning permission (all matters reserved except for access) sought for up to 595 dwellings including affordable housing; a two-form entry primary school with associated outdoor space and vehicle parking; local facilities comprising a Class A1 retail store of up to 480 sq m GIA and up to 560sqm GIA of "flexible use" floorspace that can be used for one or more of the following uses - A1 (retail), A2 (financial and professional services), A3 (restaurants and cafes), D1 (non-residential institutions); a rugby clubhouse / community building of up to 375 sq m GIA, three standard RFU sports pitches and associated vehicle parking; a link road between Borden Lane and Chestnut Street / A249; allotments; and formal and informal open space incorporating SuDS, new planting / landscaping and ecological enhancement works. Full planning permission is sought for the erection of 80 dwellings including affordable housing, open space, associated SuDS. For clarity - the total number of dwellings proposed across the site is up to 675.

Cllr Harvey informed Councillors that the application has been refused and will now be determined at appeal.

Ref: 19/503293/FULL: Car Showroom, London Road, Upchurch ME9 7PD

<u>Proposal:</u> Change of use of auto showroom and workshop (Sui Generis) to a banqueting hall, including food processing and distribution (Class D2 and B2), including the creation of a mezzanine floor and alterations to fenestration.

Cllr Harvey reported the application had been refused and that a further application has been submitted and will be dealt with next month.

Ref: 18/505060/ADJ (Alternative ref: 18/504836/EIOUT) Binbury Park, Detling Hill, Detling, Proposal: Adjoining Authority Consultation from Maidstone Borough Council for Outline application (with all matters reserved apart from access) for the erection of up to 1,750 dwellings including affordable housing, 46,000 sq.m of commercial space, a hotel, a local centre, a new primary school, a park and ride facility, strategic highways improvements including new Kent Showground access/egress, accesses/roads including a new bridleway bridge, parking, associated open space, landscaping, services, and Sustainable Drainage Systems. In addition the proposals include a publicly-accessible country park including the Binbury Motte and Bailey Castle Scheduled Ancient Monument. Cllr Harvey said the proposal still has not been discussed.

Cllr Harvey reported the Appeal has been dismissed which is good for the village and an important precedent regarding air quality issues.

Ref: 19/504593/LAWPRO 40-42 London Road, Newington ME9 7NR

Proposal: Lawful Development Certificate for the proposed change of use from B1 office to C3 residential.

Councillors considered the application and had no objection to the proposal.

ii. Ref: 19/503528/FULL

Address: The Vicarage, Church Lane, Newington, ME9 7JU

Proposal: Demolition of existing garage, outbuilding and boundary wall. Erection of 3no. detached, three bedroom dwellings with associated landscaping, parking and access.

Councillors considered the application and were concerned the proposal will increase the traffic in Church Lane; the cumulative build up of traffic with Parsonage Farm having been developed since the earlier application had been approved; the impact on air quality; it is a Rectory serving six parishes so would expect it to be a large house with grounds; there are regular traffic jams in Church Lane.

It was AGREED UNANIMOUSLY to object to the proposal

iii. Ref: 19/504153/FULL

Address: Land Rear Of 148 High Street, Newington ME9 7JH

Proposal: Conversion of former agricultural barn to a dwellinghouse, including demolition of existing feed and bedding stores and erection of a single storey extension to form an annexe, with associated car parking and access driveway.

Councillors considered the application and noted that work on the car park has already started. The barn has been used as a store and not for agricultural purposes; there will be increased traffic; the Planning Inspector said the proposal is outside the built environment; an annexe should be linked to the main building, if approved there should be a condition that the annexe can only be used by residents of the house; it will start to erode the village envelope; and the access is narrow.

It was **AGREED UNANIMOUSLY** to object to the proposal

10. AMENITIES COMMITTEE

<u>i. To receive the minutes of the Amenities Committee meeting held on 17 September and consider the recommendations</u>

Cllr Layer **PROPOSED** to accept the minutes as a true record of the meeting held on 17 September; **SECONDED** by Cllr Harvey: **AGREED UNANIMOUSLY**. Cllr Jackson signed the minutes as a true record of the meeting.

Cllr Layer informed Members that PCSO John Cork had attended the meeting and had reported that there were not many issues within the village.

Cllr Jackson congratulated Cllr Layer for completing the Play Area Safety Course.

Cllr Harvey said he has met with a contractor regarding a quotation for an extra CCTV camera on the Pavilion.

ii. To consider budget of £50,000 for the play area

Cllr Layer **PROPOSED** to set a budget of £50,000 from the S106 money for the play area; **SECONDED** by Cllr Harvey: **AGREED UNANIMOUSLY**.

Cllr Layer reported the sputnik needs new bearings.

ACTION: Clerk to obtain quotation.

Cllr Mould said he has been tasked with liaising with the Youth Club to ascertain if they would be willing to paint the garage and is waiting to hear back from the group.

Cllr Palmer said a resident has informed him that one of the new lights needs a shade as it shines in their house.

ACTION: Cllr Palmer to send details to the Clerk.

Cllr Jackson said there will be a village litter pick on 19 October.

ACTION: Cllr Palmer to borrow the equipment from Swale and arrange for the bags of rubbish to be collected.

Cllr Layer informed members that KCC have been approached to put a memorial bench on the green.

Cllr Harvey said the Parish Council has recommended more suitable locations for memorial benches at the cemetery and the Recreation Ground.

Cllr Mould said the final decision will not be the Parish Council's.

iii. To consider quotation for play area inspection

Cllr Mould said the Council's usual play area inspector is unable to carry out the inspection due to ill health and has recommended another inspector.

Cllr Harvey **PROPOSED** to accept the quotation from Chris Newell, for £45 for the play area and £45 for the gym equipment plus the fee for a Councillor to meet with the inspector; **SECONDED** by Cllr Palmer: **AGREED UNANIMOUSLY**. Cllr Layer will meet with the inspector.

11. VILLAGE VOICE AND MEDIA

i. To receive an update

Cllr Mould said comments on the first draft of the Village Voice have been noted. Cllr Layer said the new website is very good.

ii. To consider a Social Media Policy

Cllr Palmer **PROPOSED** to adopt the Social Media Policy; **SECONDED** by Cllr Coles: **AGREED UNANIMOUSLY**.

Cllr Mould **PROPOSED** to trial a limited Facebook page with a review in three months, contents can only be added with the Clerk's approval and for the page to be "read only"; **SECONDED** by Cllr Harvey: **AGREED UNANIMOUSLY**.

14. CHURCHYARD AND CEMETERY

i. To receive an update of the Churchyard and Cemetery

Cllr Layer reported that a new grass cutting schedule has been drawn up and is being tendered in the Village Voice and on the website, the closing date is 28 October. The contractor has been asked to tidy the edge of the Cemetery. There will be a Cemetery working party on 30 October and all are welcome to help. The contractor has said some relatives have put gardens on the graves but do not maintain them causing problems with maintenance, he is also concerned about shingle on graves which damages machinery.

ACTION: Cemetery Working Group to review the regulations.

Cllr Coles said Cllr Layer has strimmed the Commonwealth War Grave for the heritage Open Day, the History Group will discuss the grave and the possibility of defining the edges.

Cllr Layer said the church yard behind the church is a mess.

Cllr Mould reported that Cllr Haigh had installed signs at the cemetery for visitors to dispose of rubbish properly.

Cllr Mould thanked Cllr Layer for his report.

15. HIGHWAYS

Cllr Jackson raised concern about the temporary closure of footpath ZR60. Cllr Harvey said it will only be closed during brickearth extraction to protect the public.

16. STREET LIGHTING

Cllr Mould said there will be a meeting with the contractor; Cllr Haigh, Cllr Layer and Cllr Jackson will attend and must give dates of availability.

17. REPORTS FROM MEMBERS

Cllr Palmer reported that he and Cllr Harvey had attended the KALC Swale Area Committee meeting which had a very informative presentation from Prof Stephen Packham.

Cllr Harvey said views were being sought regarding local committees although they may be no benefit.

Cllr Palmer said three committees have been suggested for Sittingbourne, Sheppey and Faversham with possible a fourth committee for rural areas. It would be possible for smaller planning applications to be looked at by the committees which could have representatives from Parish Councils and Community Groups.

Cllr Harvey reported that he had also spoken to Simon Algar, Swale Conservation Officer, as Swale Borough Council are to review the Conservation Areas and Newington will be the first parish to be reviewed. The Parish Council and a local historian would be involved and if the Conservation Area is enhanced it will help to protect the area.

Cllr Mould reported the school roles at both Newington and Lower Halstow Schools have increased.

Cllr Harvey asked if it can be ascertained how many pupils are from the Persimmon development.
